

If you happened to miss the American Film Institute's programme, '100 Years, 100 Heroes and Villains' when it aired Tuesday, 2 June, you didn't miss much. Then again, maybe you did.

Despite being featured in two highlights for two other nominees, Luke Skywalker did mot make the list. This reminds me of the Entertainment Weekly survey, that ran about 2 years ago. After some rather dubious, umm... massaging of the results, extending the deadline, etc, EW completely ignored the greatest hero category when it published the article in their 'zine. Why, do you ask? Because the character they wanted/expected to win, did not. Who won? Luke Skywalker.

From the AFI website:

*Hero: For voting purposes, a "hero" was defined as a character(s) who prevails in extreme circumstances and dramatizes a sense of morality, courage and purpose. Though they may be ambiguous or flawed, they often sacrifice themselves to show humanity at its best.

The ironic part is that CBS, who aired the AFI special, had a survey on their website, asking people to vote for their hero and villain. When I last checked, Luke Skywalker was in the lead in the hero category.
