

The Big Red One

The newly restored version of Samuel Fuller's 'The Big Red One' continues to generate a lot of interest. Originally released in 1980, the film while good, was not the project Mr Fuller had envisioned. Until his death in 1997, he had hoped to restore the film to how he had wanted it.

With the discovery of over 70,000 feet of 'lost' footage, over 50 minutes have been

restored. This equates to something like 15 added scenes, and a cameo appearace by Samuel Fuller as a news reporter.

Premiering in NYC on 12 November 2004, it has been featured in several film fes-

tivals around the United States. Plans are for it to be released to dvd in 2005.
