
Mark also shared in the acceptance for the *Star Wars Trilogy's* Best Overall DVD Classic Film Award.

brother of Judith Oakman Myers, David's mother. While the sheriff decides that it is suicide, Zeek still has some doubts. (There're some more family connections. But these everyone should find out while watching the movie.) The crime scene proves it: John Myers doesn't wear boots, but there's mud on the stool he had been standing on, and the stool isn't lying on the floor.

Zeek concentrates on the dead body to secure the proofs when David Myers appeared. He had arrived the other day and hadn't been informed of the suicide of his father. It leads into an argument with the sheriff. Then Zeek spotted further bruises on the victim's neck he must have gotten before he died. It gives him another bit of proof that it was murder and not suicide. Zeek got all his knowledge just from books, so he suggests getting another opinion. But the sheriff disagreed which left Zeek quite frustrated.

In the meantime, David Myers met Jason's sister, Iris Buchanan. She lives with her brother in their parents' house. They vanished years ago. Her friend thinks that David would be a good match for Iris since there aren't many attractive men in town. She goes to David's father's house to meet him and realizes that he's a bit strange, and yet she's attracted to him, though her brother tells her to stay away from David. He also gives the warning to David to stay away from his sister. But they meet again and David learned that Jason had beaten his former girlfriend to death and bringing the dead body away after learning that she got pregnant.

Then David finds in a mud hole near his house a wrecked car with a dead body in-

side. You never learn who that dead body is but Jason is acting very suspect again.



All is running out of control when Jason learned from David that David had spent a night with his sister, Iris, and her friend is waiting for him. He has a crush on her but some sexual problems. So when she joked about it he strangles her and brings her back to her own home where Iris finds the dead body. The reason that David already has a criminal record which her brother had told her and that he thinks that he is involved with the death of their parents because the nurse had come to them first back then from his own mother who had died. Now Iris is really thinking that David had murdered her girlfriend. She runs back home to tell Jason.

Jason's plans seem to have worked but he had overseen a small detail. Iris' friend had told her that she wanted to try one last time to seduce Jason and to give him one last chance before she wants to look for someone else. She had shown Iris the negligees she would wear. And one of it was now hanging in her room. She knows now that her friend must have been here and since she has just come from David it could be only Jason who had murdered her. She tries not to show it her brother.

Then David calls her to tell her that Zeek had found out that the second bruise on the neck had been caused by a flashlight used by the police. Iris doesn't tell her brother who had called which made him suspiciously. Together they drive back to the house of Iris' friend. When Iris comes out again without mentioning the dead body, Jason now knows that his sister must know everything and decides to kill her too. He hits her to leave her unconscious to drive with her to David Myers. Jason wants to force him to strangle himself first before killing his sister.

The situation seems to be hopeless. Iris isn't as strong as her brother and can't actually do anything. But somehow Zeek had watched all and shoots first the robe David was already hanging on and when Jason wanted to use his own weapon against his sister

Iris and David leave Reeseville but then they decide to come back and ask Zeek to start refurbishing the house David had gotten from his father. Iris told David that she's pregnant.

The last scene of the movie is as Zeek checks his answering machine while cuddling with his tomcat called Watson.

Reeseville was released on DVD 14 February 2005, in the UK. Region 2 only. In the US, it is still being shown at film festivals and in short runs.
